

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program Public Service Announcement

Beginning April 1, 2020, action pact will operate the cooling component Low-Income Home Energy Assistance program funded by the Department of Human Services. Program income guidelines have been set at 60% of the state's median income.

Only elderly and homebound households may call for an appointment from April 1, 2020 until April 30, 2020. **To qualify as an elderly household**, <u>all</u> adult members of the household must be 65 years of age or older. To qualify as a homebound household, there can be no one in the household who is not homebound, or you must be the sole caretaker of a homebound member. All other income-eligible applicants may call beginning May 1, 2020 and will be served if funds are available.

Residents must call the local action pact Service Center to schedule an appointment.
